












DAY OF BAD




LOST IN A SILENT PLACE

curatorial practices

COMME des GARÇONS, In Japan in 2007, with no specific collection mentioned





During the curatorial practices course, with Professor and curator Maria Luisa Frisa, and Simona Fulceri, a project was carried out in which we worked in groups of two. Each group selected a garment from the IUAV archive and had to complete a technical sheet and then create the display on a mannequin by performing volumetric construction using padding and suitable materials. The chosen garment was a knit suit and skirt by COMME des GARÇONS, and we worked on the mannequin using stockings, tulle, and padding to achieve a good fit of the garment on the mannequin.





In the technical sheet, we conducted research regarding its conservation status, place of origin, and current location, and we noted any damages if present. Furthermore, a detailed description of its composition, special stitches, and measurements was provided to identify the type of mannequin suitable for dressing the garment.

This project allowed us to understand how preliminary research is conducted on archive garments and how, depending on their peculiarities, they should be preserved and displayed for a potential museum exhibition.

During the IUAV modeling course, each student was assigned a designer to take inspiration from. I've been assigned **Vivienne Westwood**, One of my favorite inspirations and designers.

My projects and ideas are inspired by his punk-rock aesthetic, but at the same time elegant and very feminine.

For this project two garments had to be made: jacket and skirt, shirt and trousers.

I decided to be inspired by her first fashion show "Pirates" of 1981, where on the one hand her ex-husband McClaren is fascinated by the movie "The Island" while Vivienne by the dandies of the eighteenth century and the aesthetics of Native Americans: So let's see their ideas merge into a collection.

MOODBOARD:

I bring back on the one hand the class of Vivienne Westwood, through the use of tartan, the main fabric of his creations, and on the other hand the irregularities of the dress packaging, a representative sign of his style.

I also wanted to go deep on my research of men's clothing in the middle of the French Revolution, in particular on sans-culottes, a sort of sallors' trousers, wide and long up to the ankle, which had a flap with three buttons on the front. The dresses want to bring back the sensuality and feminine elegance and at the same time in the cut and line the spontaneity and nonconformist irregularity of vivienne Westwood.
